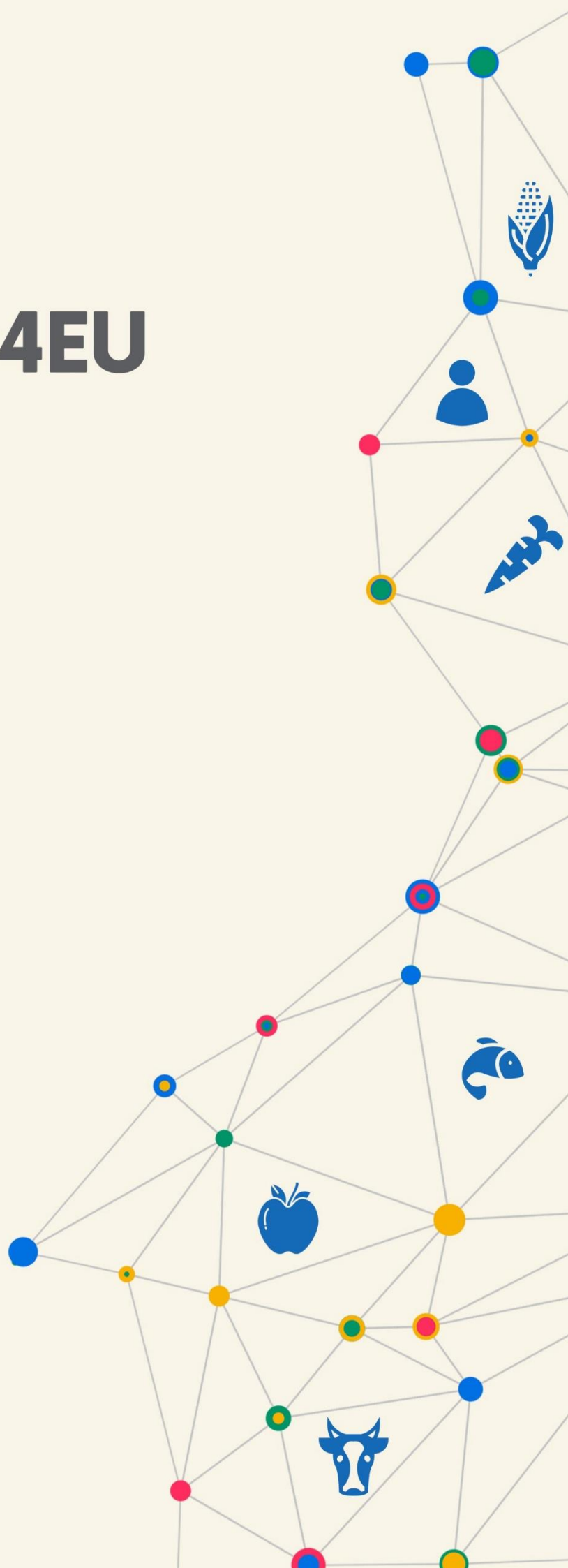

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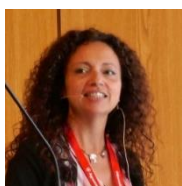

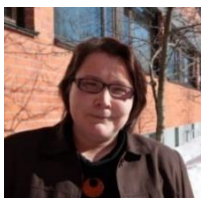

AFSCA works in close collaboration with various federal and regional public services, including police and customs, and has a network of internal and external laboratories. At AFSCA a Scientific Committee is established occupying a central position regarding risk assessment of the food chain.
