

An important role in the renovation of residential buildings, both in the countries of the European Union and in Ukraine, is played by the establishment of One-Stop Shop (OSS) platforms for housing renovation and modernization. Such service structures contribute to accelerating the pace of energy renovation by providing comprehensive support to homeowners at all stages of project implementation.

The project “Building Skills for Housing Renovation through One-Stop Shop (OSS) Solutions” (BUSHROSSs) aims to provide stakeholders responsible for the creation and operation of OSS in the housing renovation sector with specialized knowledge and practical tools for the effective management of such structures.

The main objective of the Project is to develop the competencies of representatives of national, regional, and local authorities, municipalities, energy agencies, and other stakeholders in order to ensure the sustainable and effective functioning of OSS and to provide homeowners with comprehensive support throughout the energy renovation process.

In accordance with the requirements of the Consortium Agreement, and in order to ensure proper oversight of project implementation, a Quality Assurance and Risk Management Team (QARMT) and an Impact Assessment Team (IAT) have been established. These bodies include representatives from all partner organizations involved in the implementation of the Project.

Yevhen Antypov has been appointed as a member of the **Advisory Board** representing the National University of Life and Environmental Sciences of Ukraine, Educational and Research Institute of Energy, Automation and Energy Saving. The first meeting of the Board was also attended by Project experts: **Viktor Kaplun, Svitlana Makarevych, Olena Shelimanova, and Vitalii Savchenko**. The first meeting of the Advisory Board was held in an online format.


Task 5.2: Implementation of train the trainers concept through conduction of trainings for Training Champions (TCs)
