Course description

The course aims to develop international professional communication skills in English in the context of IT. Students improve their language skills for effective communication with colleagues, clients and partners in an international environment by participating in role-plays, discussions, presentations and practical tasks.

Course objectives

- Develop professional communication skills in English in the IT field.
- Develop the ability to present yourself, team, and project.
- Expand vocabulary on topics related to international communication, teamwork, and cultural differences.
- Study B1-level grammar structures in a professional context.

Expected learning outcomes

Students will be able to:

- Introduce themselves and their role in an international IT project.
- Participate in professional meetings in English.
- Communicate ethically with foreign partners.
- Create and present their own IT projects.
