# German-Ukrainian Summer School in Agricultural Economics

<b>Description / Main topics</b>	The summer school is aimed at Ukrainian doctoral candidates in the field of agricultural economics. The participants are supposed to learn to apply theoretical concepts of economics to evaluate agricultural policy measures. The students will learn how to justify and criticize agricultural policy interventions, the specifics of agricultural markets, the possibilities and limits of welfare analysis, and governance problems. During the social programme the Ukrainian Participants will get to know details and information about the German inner- and outer university research system in Agricultural studies. They will also get practical insights in selected companies of the agricultural and food sector in Saxony-Anhalt.
<b>Teaching methods</b>	Tours (40%), lectures and seminars (40%), classroom exercises and group work (20%)
<b>Grading</b>	For a certificate of successful participation, participants are required to pass an oral exam: 3 Credit Points
<b>Language</b>	English
<b>Requirements</b>	Outstanding Master's degree (or equivalent) in agricultural/food economics, general economics, or related fields. Participants should have a good knowledge of the basic microeconomic concepts and a basic knowledge of econometrics.
<b>Application</b>	Electronic applications (in English language) should be submitted <b>as one PDF-file</b> (no larger than 2 MB) to Ms. Valentyna Marusiak ( <a href="mailto:vmarusiak@kse.org.ua">vmarusiak@kse.org.ua</a> ) and should contain the following documents: (1) Letter of motivation (up to 1 page), (2) Curriculum vitae, and (3) Electronic copies of relevant transcripts and certificates of Master's degree (or equivalent). <b>Applications will be considered until 03.02.2019</b>
