COURSE DESCRIPTION

Discipline "International private law" is optional. The purpose of the discipline is to provide students with a deep and thorough study of the basic provisions of the science of international private law, in particular, international property and inheritance law, international intellectual property law, obligations in international private law, international private procedural law.

As a result of studying the educational component, higher education students will master the following competencies:
