ACADEMIC DISCIPLINE DESCRIPTION

The course is an introductory designed course for the Bachelor student, which provides the basic concepts of all aspects of Ukrainian Statehood.

Aim: train the highly qualified specialists on the basis of the processes of the humanization of school, integration of the professional and social-humanitarian base, improvement of the content and structure of the course, use of the achievements of the world and national ideas, common values.

Objectives: study of the history of Ukrainian statehood and the deep understanding of the history of formation of the Ukrainian people and Ukrainian state system, consolidation of the national originality, interpretation of the political activity of the classes and social group in Ukraine at the certain stages of the historical development.
